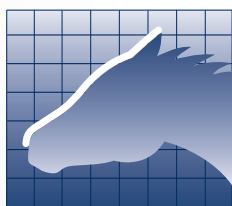

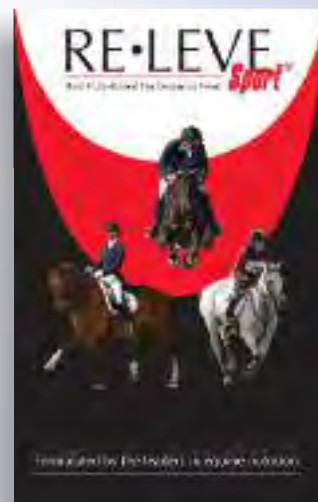

A *BIT* ABOUT FEI WORLD CUP™ JUMPING

Now in 34th season, the FEI World Cup™ series began in 1978 with Jumping. The series was extended to Dressage in 1985, Driving in 2001 and Eventing in 2003. Last year, the inaugural FEI World Cup™ Vaulting Final took place in Leipzig sharing the spotlight with Jumping, Dressage and Driving and this year the very first season of FEI World Cup™ Vaulting will take place.

The FEI World Cup™ series, which is now outranked only by the FEI World Equestrian Games™ and the Olympics in importance to equestrian sport, was created with the idea of producing a unified series of equestrian competitions similar to the Formula One Championship.

FEI World Cup™ Jumping - early years

The event was an instant success, largely due to the support of the first sponsor, Volvo, which ensured a world-class venue and well-qualified staff, and sufficient financing to cover travel expenses and prize money. This allowed the organisers to attract the very best horses and riders from Europe and North America.

A regional league system was established so that riders could qualify in competitions in their own region. Then, only the very best would come together at a grand finale to compete for the top honours.

The first season of the FEI World Cup™ Jumping competitions consisted of nine indoor events in Europe and seven in North America, with the Final held in Gothenburg in 1979. Although other continents also took part from the early days of the competition, rivalry between European and American riders dominated the 1980s.

Following the success of the inaugural series, riders from Australia were invited to compete in the FEI World Cup™ for the following season, and in 1980-

1981 a South American league was established. In the following year, the United States was split into East and West to form two separate qualifying regions, and then a Canadian League was created. Since then, New Zealand, Eastern Europe, Japan, Central Asia, South Africa, South East Asia, and the Persian Gulf States have also joined the FEI World Cup™.

FEI World Cup™ Jumping today

The FEI World Cup™ Jumping now comprises 14 leagues across the globe. In the 1995/1996 season Austria's Hugo Simon won the very first Final, riding Gladstone. He went on to jump to victory again in 1996 and in 1997, making him the first rider to win the FEI World Cup™ three times.

From seasons two to 11, the series winners all hailed from North America - seven from the United States and three from Canada. Canada's Mario Deslauriers, who took the title with Aramis in 1984 at age 19, remains the youngest-ever winner.

Germany holds the record for the greatest number of victories, winning nine out of the 33 seasons, while the United States has won seven. Next comes Austria with four.

Hugo Simon's three victories were an undoubtedly impressive feat, although in recent years the achievements of Rodrigo Pessoa and Meredith Michaels-Beerbaum have eclipsed the records of previous riders.

Rolex Testimonee and Brazilian champion Rodrigo Pessoa's partnership with his stallion Baloubet du Rouet produced three consecutive wins: 1998 in Helsinki, 1999 in Gothenburg and 2000 in Las Vegas. German rider Meredith Michaels-Beerbaum, another Rolex Testimonee, and her mount Shutterfly - retired at 2011 CHIO Aachen - have also been a



highly celebrated partnership, equalling the three victories of Rodrigo Pessoa and Hugo Simon by winning in 2005, in 2008 and 2009 in Las Vegas.

With the singular exception of Rodrigo Pessoa, all FEI World Cup™ Jumping winners until now have come from either Europe or North America. However, the series continues to evolve around the world, and in 2006 the Final was held in Kuala Lumpur.

In the course of the 2007-2008 season, the event's 30th anniversary, Rolex became the title sponsor of the series. Through the commitment and support of Rolex, now in its fourth year of sponsorship, the Rolex FEI World Cup™ competition has continued to grow in influence and stature.

FEI World Cup™ Jumping Rules

FEI World Cup™ Jumping riders and horses are put to the test on courses that are highly technical requiring courage, scope, accuracy and control. Athletes and their trainers always walk the course on foot before the start of the competition in order to learn the course and work out the best route between the 10 -13 knockable obstacles, which can have double and treble combinations and features such as water jumps.

The fences are often eye-catching and perfectly suited to television and on-site fans and the course designer will often incorporate a national flavour featuring local landmarks and attractions.

Penalties

The obstacles are numbered and horse and rider must jump them in the correct order, aiming to complete the course without lowering any of the fences or landing in the water. Knockdowns and refusals, when the horse stops or runs out at a fence, are penalised. A knockdown is only penalised if the horse lowers the highest part of the fence, so if a lower pole is knocked there is no penalty.

If the horse or rider falls they are eliminated.

The winner is the horse and rider combination with the lowest number of penalties, but the clock is also a deciding factor.

JUMPER CLASSES

NOMINATION FEE - \$225

Nomination Fee & Eligibility: To be eligible for the Jumper Division horses must be nominated and the nominating fee of \$225 paid by the closing date of entries. Horses nominated after that date will pay a nominating fee of \$250. Once a horse is nominated, he becomes eligible to compete in the following sections: 1.45m, 1.40m, 1.35m, 1.30m, Junior/Amateur-Owner Jumper High & Low, Adult Amateur Jumper, Children's Jumper and all special classes held in the Jumper Division, if otherwise eligible.

Eligibility for rider, handler and horse refer to USEF JP 100.1 and 2.

Jumper Division will follow all current rules of the USEF and FEI Rule Books.

Ties: Horses tied for other than first will be placed based on their time in the first round, unless otherwise stated.

Courses: May consist of any combination of the following: brush, gates, oxers, planks and rails, water, liverpool, ditch, verticals, wall, and panels.

Starting Order: Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule JP 112.

Schooling, Tack & Equipment, Conduct & Attire: According to the FEI (when necessary) and General Regulations and USEF Rules except where otherwise noted.

Declarations: Horses must be declared for their class no later than 5:00 p.m. the day before the class is to be held unless otherwise noted.

American Gold Cup FEI Classes

Inspection: All horses will be presented for the veterinary examination & horse inspection on Thursday 9/13 starting at 7 - 9 am in the FEI Stabling Compound. An FEI Approved Passport must be presented with the horse brought for inspection.

Stable & Schooling: All horses entered in this class are required to be on grounds AND stabled in the official FEI stable area no later than Wednesday 9/12 by 9:00am. All horses from this point forward are required to wear their assigned back number whenever leaving the official FEI stable area. Horses may be schooled only during posted schooling hours and in designated warm-up areas. FEI equipment rules apply. Horse boot and leg inspections will take place without prior notice to the competitor.

Drug Rules: Conducted under FEI Medication and treating rules and procedures. Drug testing will be provided by USEF.

1. Every class offered herein which is covered by either the rules and specification of the current Federation Rule Book or the FEI Rule books and will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith. The rated sections of this Competition are official USEF point competitions for the USEF National and USEF Zone Horse of the Year Awards.

Class #101, #102 & #103 are run in accordance with FEI Rules.

2. FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP & ENTRY AGREEMENT

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE PRELIMINARY LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NONMEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$30 NONMEMBER REGISTRATION FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing the entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaultor or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

3. Closing Date of Entries: Friday, August 31 2012

a) Entry Forms will be accepted only when signed by the owner or his authorized agent, the trainer, coach and the rider and accompanied by a check for nomination (if required), drug, office fee \$65, and stall fees. Horses not entered

in the competition but stabled on grounds are required to pay a non showing fee of \$50. No acknowledgements will be mailed for this event.

A fine of \$100 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.

All entry balance/credit(s) of \$10 or less at the close of the show shall be expensed accordingly.

b) Each entry form must provide signatures and membership numbers for the owner, rider, trainer, coach and a horse USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider, trainer proper mailing address; telephone numbers and either a Social Security Number or Federal Employer's Identification for Prize Money.

c) USEF IHP Fees: All riders competing in any FEI sanctioned class are subject to USEF International High Performance rule see USEF GR 207 for fees due to the Federation.

d) FEI Registration Fees: All horses and riders competing in a FEI recognized competition must have a FEI Rider Registration Number and a Horse Registration Number. Go to www.usef.org.

e) The owner as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.

f) Nominations for Jumper Sections and classes close August 31. Post nominations will be accepted after the closing date at the regular nominating fee of \$225 plus a late charge of \$50 unless otherwise stated.

g) Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 5:00 p.m. the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At managements discretion entries received after 5:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed.

Late or improper Grand Prix/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$15,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 class; \$200 per \$100,000 will be assessed without exception.

In the event of acceptance of a later declaration, the declared entrant will be placed in the #1 position in the Order of Go.

h) Horses shown in classes in which they have not been entered in will be required to pay double the entry fee in those classes.

4. Scratches:

a) In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made, once the class has started, the entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.

b) \$100 of the nomination fee will be refunded to the owners of horses that have been scratched (scratch sheet) twenty-four hours prior to the start of the competition. If the horse is scratched within 24 hours to the start of the competition, an Official Veterinarians Certificate filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian and must be presented to the Secretary prior to the conclusion of the last class of the competition in order to obtain this refund. If a horse is scratched after competing in any class at the competition, no refund of the nominating fee will be given.

c) Horses entered in classes must be scratched by written notice and presented or sent to the Competition Secretary. No Vet certificate is required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the class scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$20 per class office processing fee.

Once a class has started, horses that did not compete but in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate must be filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian, certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition. Entry fees will then be credited less the processing fee of \$60 per horse.

5. a) Stabling: ALL HORSES AND PONIES ARE REQUIRED TO BE STABLED ON GROUNDS. Temporary stalls 10 x 10 with gates housed under canvass.

Regular Stabling is provided with doors at a cost of \$250 per stall.

FEI Stabling is provided in a secure compound at a cost of \$300 per stall.

Competing out of a van or a truck parked on the competition grounds is prohibited.

STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.

b) **Arrival of Horses:** All horses may begin arriving after 9:00 am Tuesday. Horses entered in FEI Classes #101, #102 & #103 must be on the grounds by 9:00 am Wednesday September 12. FEI Inspection will be held Thursday 7:00am - 9:00 am.

All horses entered in class #116 must be on grounds by Friday at 10:00am.

All horses NOT entered in FEI classes or #116 must be on the grounds no later than 5:00pm the day preceding the start of the first competition of their jumper section whether they are entered in that class or not.

6. a) Prize money will be credited to the entry's show account after the results of the class winnings are posted or a check will be mailed to the Prize Money recipient at the address on the entry blank within thirty days after the show, thereby ending the show's responsibility as long as all criteria has been met. Exhibitors must provide a social security number or Federal TIN for the prize money recipient.

If a prize money recipient is not denoted the prize money will automatically go to the owner. FEI Prize money will be distributed to winning Owners, lessees or competitors no later than immediately after the last Competition of the event provided they have met all their financial and other obligations to the Horse Show. Any excess prize money will be mailed to the prize money recipient.

b) Prize Money Won by Foreign Competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.

c) Lost or stolen prize money checks will be reissued only after a 180 day waiting period from the original check date has passed. In the event of unauthorized redeeming of a check, Stadium Jumping, Inc. will provide check copies to exhibitors and will be held harmless from the collection process.

7. Show Office Hours: The Show Office will be open beginning one hour before the start of each show day and will close upon completion of the last class. Exhibitor accounts will be processed and numbers given out in the show office the day preceding the show starting at 9:00 am.
8. Horses competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.
9. No horses or ponies will be allowed in any class 'hors concours' during the show.
10. Horses will be allowed in the show rings only at such hours as are announced by Competition Management.
11. Starting Orders of Go are produced in accordance with USEF JP 112 unless otherwise noted.
12. Attire: Proper attire is required unless otherwise stated.

Formal Attire: Competitors must wear scarlet, blue, green or black coats, white

breeches, white shirts with white stock, choker or tie.

13. Parking: All trucks, autos, golf carts and other motorized vehicles must be parked in designated areas only. To insure the safety of all exhibitors, any motorized vehicles (electric or gasoline) on the show grounds must only be operated by persons with a valid drivers license.

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

14. In order to remove any animal or equipment from the show grounds, a release must be obtained from the Show Secretary.

15. All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule is strictly enforced.

16. GR801 2/3 It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience. BOD 1/14/12 Effective 4/1/12

3. Except as may otherwise be mandated by local law, all sub-juniors riding in the Paso Fino division, while riding anywhere on the competition grounds, must wear properly fitting protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. Harness must be secured and properly fitted. Any rider violating this rule at any time must immediately be prohibited from further riding until such headgear is properly in place. For all exhibitors competing in the hunter or hunter seat equitation section, if a rider's chin strap becomes unfastened, the rider may stop, re-fasten the chin strap and continue his/her round without penalty or elimination. A judge may, but is not required to stop a rider and ask them to refasten a chin strap which has become unfastened, again without penalty to the rider. Members of the Armed Services or the Police may wear the Service Dress Uniform. BOD 1/23/11 Effective 12/1/11

17. No mounted exhibitor may wear or carry an electronic communication device (i.e., cellular telephone, pager, walkie talkie, etc.) while in the competition ring. The penalty for wearing or carrying a forbidden device if observed by the judge is elimination from the class during which the device was worn or carried. Exception: A handicapped participant may use electronic devices if, prior to the class, he/she presents to the USEF Steward written justification from treating personnel setting forth the necessity of the equipment.

- All schooling areas are sand & fiber mix. All rings and schooling areas have drainage mats installed below the surface to insure quality footing.

19. In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All Exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

20. Insurances:

STADIUM JUMPING, INC., OLD SALEM FARM, THE HAKIM FAMILY, THEIR OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES WILL NOT BE HELD RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY ACCIDENT TO HORSE, PROPERTY OR ANY PERSONS ON THE PROPERTY OR OLD SALEM FARM, NOR WILL THE OFFICERS, DIRECTORS OR ANYONE CONNECTED WITH THE EVENT BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ANY SUCH ACCIDENT OR DAMAGE. EXHIBITORS AND SPECTATORS SHALL HOLD THEM HARMLESS AND INDEMNIFY THEM AGAINST ANY LEGAL PROCEEDINGS ARISING FROM SUCH ACCIDENT OR DAMAGE, AS A CONDITION OF ENTRY.

"All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."

21. Should any question arise that is not provided for in the rules, the same shall be referred to the Show Committee whose decision shall be final.

"General Regulations", 23rd Edition, effective 1st January 2009, updates effective 1st January 2012 will apply:

Art. 137.1

Every horse entered for any competition at CNs or CIMs (see Appendix E) in a country other than the country of the Horse's nationality and all Horses entered for other CIs, CIOs, FEI Championships, Regional, Olympic Games and Paralympic Games, whether at home or away from the country of its nationality (see GRs 139.2), must have an official, valid FEI passport, or a national passport approved by the FEI and accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card and, when applicable, an FEI registration number, as a means of identification and to establish ownership. In the case of horses permanently resident in a member state of the European Union, all horses must have an acceptable National EU approved passport in compliance with regulation (EC) No 504/2008, to which an FEI recognition is applied. The exception to the latter being the possession of AM FEI passport which has been continually revalidated without any interruption.

Art. 137.2

Horses taking part in CNs and CIMs (see Appendix E) and in CSIP and CSICH-A in their country of nationality are not required to have such a passport as is mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered with the FEI and identifiable and, unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate. All horses permanently resident within a member state of the European Union, must have as minimum a suitable national EU approved passport in compliance with regulation (EC) No 504/2008.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and Athletes must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.

A person who is required to file an information return with the IRS must obtain your correct taxpayer identification number (TIN) to report, for example, income paid to you, real estate transactions, mortgage interest you paid, acquisition or abandonment of secured property, cancellation of debt, or contributions you made to an IRA.

Use Form W-9 only if you are a U.S. person (including a resident alien), to provide your correct TIN to the person requesting it (the requester) and, when applicable, to:

1. Certify that the TIN you are giving is correct (or you are waiting for a number to be issued),
2. Certify that you are not subject to backup withholding, or
3. Claim exemption from backup withholding if you are a U.S. exempt payee. If applicable, you are also certifying that as a U.S. person, your allocable share of any partnership income from a U.S. trade or business is not subject to the withholding tax on foreign partners' share of effectively connected income.

Note. If a requester gives you a form other than Form W-9 to request your TIN, you must use the requester's form if it is substantially similar to this Form W-9.

Definition of a U.S. person. For federal tax purposes, you are considered a U.S. person if you are:

- An individual who is a U.S. citizen or U.S. resident alien,
- A partnership, corporation, company, or association created or organized in the United States or under the laws of the United States,
- An estate (other than a foreign estate), or
- A domestic trust (as defined in Regulations section 301.7701-7).

Special rules for partnerships. Partnerships that conduct a trade or business in the United States are generally required to pay a withholding tax on any foreign partners' share of income from such business. Further, in certain cases where a Form W-9 has not been received, a partnership is required to presume that a partner is a foreign person, and pay the withholding tax. Therefore, if you are a U.S. person that is a partner in a partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States, provide Form W-9 to the partnership to establish your U.S. status and avoid withholding on your share of partnership income.

The person who gives Form W-9 to the partnership for purposes of establishing its U.S. status and avoiding withholding on its allocable share of net income from the partnership conducting a trade or business in the United States is in the following cases:

- The U.S. owner of a disregarded entity and not the entity,
